Mrs. Michaud gave a presentation of data on elementary SBAC testing results and where Brooklyn ranked with surrounding towns and districts.

- NAEYC Accreditation

Mrs. Michaud stated that she is working with staff for the NAEYC accreditation. The necessary materials for the renewal have been submitted.

She explained that there are 14 standards for teacher assistant's working in preschool and kindergarten. She has been working with Mrs. Brown, Special Education Director, reviewing staff requirements as paraprofessionals are assigned.
