Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes Thursday, August 30, 2018 6:30pm Clifford B. Green Memorial Center

Present: Rick Ives, Joe Voccio, Wayne Jolley and Melissa Bradley; Recording Secretary

Also Present: Ken Dykstra and WINY radio

1. Call to Order: Mr. Ives called the meeting to order at 6:32pm.

- 2. Approve Minutes: Rick Ives made a motion to approve the minutes of 8/9/18 as presented. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- 3. Public Comment: None
- **4. Town Meeting Call 9/13/18:** Wayne Jolley made a motion to call a town meeting for 9/13/18 beginning at 7pm at the Clifford B. Green Memorial Center. Joe Voccio seconded the motion. Complete call attached. Motion passed 3-0.
- **5. Elementary School Generator Project Resolution:** Joe Voccio made a motion to approve the certified resolution enabling the First Selectman and Board of Selectmen to execute any and all necessary paperwork for the elementary school generator grant in an amount not to exceed 238,500. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.

- 10. Tree Removal

There are approximately 400 dead trees in Town that need to be removed. This is only on the non-wire sides of the road. One tree company is available to help with the removal. The cost is approximately \$50,000.

The drainage on Ennis road will cost approximately \$65,000, the pipe is already purchased. Paving of Wolf Den and Darby road will cost approximately \$60,000.

A report from DOT listed Elliot road bridge in need of restoration. A box culvert needs to be replaced. There is a bridge restoration grant the Town can apply for. This will cost approximately \$60,000.

LOCIP has a balance of \$213,000, of which \$40,000 is spoken for TAR balance - \$282,000 Highway budget - \$55,000

The trees and bridge will be priority.

- 8. Financials: The year-end financials are not completed but should be finished for the Board of Finance meeting on 9/19. The BOE has an estimated amount of \$155,000 being returned.
- 9. Special Act Discussion: Mr. Ives would like to move forward with the proposed changes from the last meeting and hold a public hearing to discuss with the residents. Mr. Voccio suggests discussing other things to try and increase participation. Joe Voccio made a motion to recommend the proposed changes for public disclosure and discussion. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- Route 6 (east Brooklyn) Cleanup: The portion of Route 6 coming into Brooklyn from 11 Danielson, over the bridge is not being maintained by the State anymore. The median is overgrown, and weeds are growing into the sidewalk. Mr. Ives is going to have our road crew or recreation crew clean it up.
- 12. Single Family Dwellings: No discussion

- Other Business: Mr. Voccio states the hearing for the proposed new regulations was excellent. 14.
