Thursday, September 27, 2018
6:30pm Clifford B. Green Memorial Center

Present: Rick Ives, Joe Voccio, Wayne Jolley, and Melissa Bradley; Recording Secretary

Also Present: Sandra Brodeur, Lou Brodeur, Bob Kelleher, Jeff Otto and WINY Radio

1. **Call to Order:** Mr. Ives called the meeting to order at 6:30pm
2. **Approve Minutes:** Joe Voccio made a motion to approve the minutes of 9/13/18 as presented. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
3. **Public Comment:** None
4. **Discussion on Inland/Wetlands Board Size:** The commission has requested a change in the number of members. They have suggested reducing the members to 5 with alternates. Mr. Ives would like to discuss this further at the next meeting.
5. **Paving Update:** Allen Hill will not be chip sealed this year, it is too late in the season. It will be done in the Spring. Darby Road and Wolf Den are scheduled for the third week in October. The approximate cost will be \$169,000. Ennis Road project RFP will be going out this week. The cost will be approximately \$70,000.
6. **Tree Removal Update:** The cost for tree removal will be approximately \$50,000. Northern will be back in Town on Monday and working here three days a week.
7. **LOCIP Request:** There is \$213,000 in the LOCIP account. About half of that will be used with a combination of TAR and Roads & Bridges for these projects. TAR fund is \$341,000. There is a box culvert on Elliot road the State has said needs to be replaced. These accounts will fund that as well.
8. **Single Family Dwellings:** No discussion
9. **Calls for Service:** No discussion

10. Other Business: None

11. Approve Bills: Joe Voccio made a motion to approve voucher #1030 in the amount of \$52,460.07. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.

12. Public Comment: Mr. Kelleher is concerned with the complicated issues brought to Inland Wetlands, that if the board is reduced to five, there may not be enough members with experience or education on the matters brought to the board.

Joe Voccio made a motion to recess the meeting at 6:45pm to open the Town Meeting. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.

Mr. Ives reconvened the meeting at 7:03pm.

13. Discussion on Special Act: Mr. Ives reviews the ordinance and the recommended changes to be made. The Board of Education would consist of 6 members for 4-year terms and they would rotate every 2 years. Discussion ensued on nominations and parties selected. The majority of people present are in favor of the change. Mr. Ives states he will hold another hearing only if resident feedback requests it.

The other ordinance for review would give the elected Selectmen fifteen days to take office after elections. If no action is taken, this will automatically happen by default.

14. Adjourn: Joe Voccio made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 7:25pm.

**AN ORDINANCE TO SET THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE
MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF BROOKLYN, CONNECTICUT THAT:

1. The Board of Education shall continue to consist of six (6) members. Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes § 9-206(b), at the Town Election to be held on November 5, 2019, six members of the Board of Education shall be elected, three of whom shall have a term of two years and three of whom shall have a term of four years. At each Town Election thereafter, three members of the Board of Education shall be elected for a term of four years. Beginning with the Town Election on November 5, 2019, and at each Town election thereafter, the terms of the members of the Board of Education shall begin on the Tuesday two weeks after the day of the Town Election, and shall continue until their successors have been elected and have qualified.
2. This ordinance shall become effective fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper having a circulation in the Town of Brooklyn.
