

- 2. Approve Minutes: Joe Voccio made a motion to approve the minutes of 5/9/19 as presented. Wayne Jolley seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- 3. Public Comment: Aaron Kerouack requests the minutes of the last meeting, under public comment be amended. The minutes read: "Joe Voccio questions Aaron Kerouack and comments he made on social media implying wrong doing was done by the Town. Mr. Kerouack did not wish to comment." Mr. Kerouack would like the minutes to reflect that he stated he did not feel public comment was the appropriate time to discuss it. Mr. Voccio states he does not have an issue making that change. Because this is a special meeting, the agenda can not be revised, this will be on the next meeting agenda.
- 4. Discussion on 2018/19 Financials: Mr. Ives states the finance director started on Monday, A meeting with the auditors is scheduled for Tuesday.

The amount authorized to be expended for each purpose shall not exceed the amount set forth opposite each purpose, provided that the Board of Selectmen may, after approval of the Board of Finance, transfer unexpended funds among purposes, so long as the total appropriation and bond authorization is not increased. The Board of Selectmen may reduce the scope of any project if funds are insufficient to complete the entire project, and the entire appropriation may be spent on the reduced project.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Selectmen recommends that the Town finance the projects by issuing the Town's bonds, notes, temporary notes or other obligations in an amount not to exceed \$629,647 or so much thereof as may be necessary after deducting grants to be received for the projects.

- <u>ITEM 1</u>. To choose a moderator for said meeting.
- ITEM 2. To hear and act upon the General Town Government Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, in the amount of \$5,644,801, as recommended by the Board of Finance.
- ITEM 3. To hear and act upon the Board of Education Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, in the amount of \$18,662,768, as recommended by the Board of Finance.

ITEM 4. To discuss and vote on a Resolution:

- (a) To appropriate \$762,147 for the costs of the 2019-2020 Capital Funding Program, consisting of various capital projects for the Town and the Town Schools;
