**Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes** Thursday, December 12, 2019
6:30pm Clifford B. Green Memorial Center

1. Call to Order: Mr. Ives called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

- 2. Approve Previous Minutes: Lou Brodeur made a motion to approve the minutes of 11/14/19 as presented. Austin Tanner seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- 3. Public Comment: Mark Putnam from Brooklyn Little League addresses a grant that was given to the Little League. The Little League received the funds, but the Town has not been reimbursed. There are questions where the grant paperwork and invoices are. Mr. Putnam states he has contacted the legislative and it is their decision to make now. Mr. Ives states he is looking into this matter and the finance director has the invoices. Mr. Putnam wants to see them at the next meeting. Mr. Ives will report more at the next meeting when he has more information.

#### 4. Appointments

- BRRC: The Selectmen agree to reach out to Joe Voccio and Wayne Jolley to see if they wish to continue on the board. This item was tabled until next meeting.
- BoFC: Lou Brodeur made a motion to reappoint Felix Ramos as a citizen member with a term expiring 12/2/2022 on the Board of Fire Commissioners. Austin Tanner seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- BEMHS: Lou Brodeur made a motion to reappoint Kurt Hall as a regular member with a term expiring 10/27/2021 on Emergency Management and Homeland Security. Austin Tanner seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- Austin Tanner made a motion to add Ethics resignation to the agenda. Lou Brodeur seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0. Lou Brodeur made a motion to accept the resignation of Jules D'Agostino from the Board of Ethics. Austin Tanner seconded the motion. Mr. Ives thanks Mr. D'Agostino for his service on the board. Motion passed 3-0.
- 5. Discussion on 2019-20 Financials: Revenues: PILOT funds were received; First ECS payment; Mashentucket has not come in yet but is expected in January. There is a bond meeting next week discussing some Brooklyn issues: 1. \$200,508 to fund Department of Corrections water line to pick up surrounding houses with polluted wells 2. \$15 million on the table for STEAP funds.

Revenues are in line for the year. Prior taxes are slightly off and the transfer station is doing good; recreation has exceeded their budgeted revenues.

- 6. Status of the 2018-19 Audit: Reconciliation of all accounts have been completed and they have received all the schedules they needed. One extension may be needed, but that will be the only one.
- **7. Discussion on Board of Ethics Ordinance:** The Selectmen have been given the revised ordinance. The ethics board asked to delay discussion at this time.
- 8. General Discussion on Future Agenda Items: No discussion. Tabled until next meeting.
- 9. Calls For Service: No discussion.
- 10. Single Family Dwellings: No discussion.
- **11. Approve Bills:** Rick Ives made a motion to approve voucher #1061 in the amount of \$460,263.17. Lou Brodeur seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- 12. Other: Austin Tanner made a motion to add pension fund recommendation to the agenda. Lou Brodeur seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.

Rick Ives made a motion to approve the recommendation of the pension fund change that was presented at the Board of Finance meeting, effective January 2, 2020. Austin Tanner seconded the motion. Full recommendation below. Motion passed 3-0.
