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Board of Finance Special Meeting Minutes Wednesday April 3, 2013 7pm Brooklyn Middle School Library

- 1. Call to Order: Mr. Ives called the meeting to order at 7:10pm.
- 2. Approve Previous Minutes: Jeff Otto made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from March 20, 2013 as presented. Kim Conroy seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.
- 3. 2013-14 Budget Discussion-Board of Education: Dr. Berry presents the budget, breakdown as follows:
 - 111.A-111.N Salaries; Proposed \$5,656,700, increase of \$202,432. Main increase was increasing the librarian from 3 ½ hours to 6 hours.
 - 112.A-132.C Salaries for Non-Teaching Personnel; Proposed \$1,187,907, increase of \$216,055
 - 201-270 Employee Benefits; Proposed \$2,208,216 decrease of \$142,598. Main decrease is in the medical insurance at 8.94%
 - 310-352.B Purchased Services; Proposed \$303,250, increase of \$49,000
 - 411.A-442 Purchased Property Services; Proposed \$148,500, increase of \$10,834
 - 519.A-581 Other Purchased Services; Proposed \$6,427,651, increase of \$70,319. KHS tuition is an estimate based on the Killingly BOE approval of 5.7% increase, this may change.
 - 611.A-690.A Supplies & Materials; Proposed \$658,545, increase of \$9,945. The bids for fuel oil and diesel fuel are not final and may change.
 - 730.A-739 Property; Proposed \$34,500, no change.
 - 810.A-810.B Other Expenses; Proposed \$70,000, increase of \$43,152.

Total proposed budget \$16,695,269 increase from 2012-2013 of \$459,139.

The School Board added \$50,000 for financial administrator services through EastConn. Mr. Otto would like to see the Town Hall involved in this process to integrate the school and town for all financial dealings of the town.

4. RFP-Auditor Discussion: Mr. Ives called and spoke with two larger firms and we, as a small town, do not fit their profile. Mr. Ives is concerned with the bid from the sole proprietor because she has only been in business since January 2013. It does not appear Marcia Marien is willing to lower her price. Mr. Ives and Ms. Demers will look a little further into this and have a recommendation at next week's meeting.

5. Public Comment: None

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6. Adjourn: Carla Demers made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:40pm. Kim Conroy seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0.
