Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes Thursday, August 11, 2016 6:30pm Clifford B. Green Memorial Center TOWN OF FRK. BROOKLYN. C.

Present: Rick Ives, Joe Voccio, Bob Kelleher and Melissa Bradley; Recording Secretary

Also Present: David Fuss, Lisa Fuss and WINY radio

- **1.** Call to Order: Mr. Ives called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.
- 2. Approve Previous Minutes: Bob Kelleher made a motion to approve the previous minutes as presented. Joe Voccio seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- 3. Public Comment: David Fuss suggests a stockade fence at the community center to prevent vandalism to the roof and kids climbing on it. Mr. Ives states the roof itself, both sections, need a lot of work and he is looking into a metal roof to eliminate the shingles. He will continue to work on the issue.
- 4. Appointment: Joe Voccio made a motion to reappoint Richard Oliverson to Inland Wetlands with a term expiring 9/12/2019. Bob Kelleher seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- 5. Budget Discussion: The year-end numbers will be ready for the Board of Finance meeting next week. The auditor plans to begin at the end of August, Mr. Ives will have a definite date for next week.
- 6. Sidewalk Ordinance Discussion: Now that there will be more sidewalks along Route 6, Mr. Ives would like to look into revising the ordinance. This will be on the next agenda for further discussion.
- 7. Street Light Discussion: A house on Church Street has been paying for a street light on the opposite side of the road, pole number 227. The previous owners requested the light be put in and the cost continued with the next owners. Because the amount was so little, the current homeowners did not notice until recently when costs went up. They contacted Channel 30 news about it and Eversource did refund some the costs they have paid. Mr. Ives states it hasn't come the Town and believes the pole may be taken down. Mr. Kelleher states depending on it is a safety issue, it should be the Towns issue, but if privately wanted, then not the Towns issue.

8. Fall Festival Update: The festival will be held on September 24/25. EDC is sponsoring the event. There is a budget of \$500 for the festival but may need to help out more if a Trooper is needed for the event. Mr. Ives is adamant Route 169 and 6 cannot be shut down and need to minimize the impact for travelers.

9. Construction Update:

- Rose Wing Roof: Mr. Kelleher updates the roof project started on Monday. They had one side done as of today and should be completed by Monday next week. The gutters will then be installed.
- Sidewalks: Mr. Ives updates the sidewalks started Monday. There was a small change order needed to fix about 85 feet of curbing. The building committee will need to hold a meeting next week or the week after.
- 10. Single Family Dwelling Report: No discussion
- 11. Calls for Service: No discussion

12. Liaison Reports:

- Board of Education: Mr. Voccio reports the new principal was hired and was introduced at the last meeting.
- **13. Other Business:** Mr. Ives states he is unable to attend the next meeting on the 25th. The Selectmen decide to hold a meeting to approve bills and anything that may arise. The next Resource Recovery meeting will go back to its regular schedule for September 29th.
- **14. Approve Bills:** Bob Kelleher made a motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$15,211.74. Joe Voccio seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.
- **15. Public Comment:** David Fuss questions where the festival will be? Mr. Ives states it will mostly be on the side of 169 where the Citizens Bank is, but there maybe something at the fire house as well as parking. The Trooper would have to be paid if it was not his scheduled 35 hours.
- **16. Adjourn:** Bob Kelleher made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Joe Voccio seconded the meeting. Meeting adjourned at 7:00pm
