Parade takes a left out of Fairgrounds onto 169 toward center of Town.

- 1. Wreath to be laid by Veteran and Boy Scout
- 2. Fire Squad and Taps
- 3. Prayer by David Burgess of Federated Church of Christ

Bugler Plays Taps (At same time, Veteran and Boy Scout place wreath on Monument (3) in front of bank, (1) at Mortlake monument, (1) at Putnam Statue and (1) at Post Office statue)

Parade continues and takes a left onto Brooklyn Common to the end. Then right onto Route 6 and then right again onto Route 169. Then down into the South Cemetery and circling the Flagpole Area:

- 1. Memorial Day Speech by Austin Tanner or Grand Marshall
- 2. Cover them Over with Beautiful Flowers Poem by Rowan Curran
- 3. Young Marine and Veteran to law wreath
- 4. Prayer by Reverend Jane Newall of Federated Church of Christ
- 5. Firing Squad Fires Volley and Bugler Plays TAPS

Parade dissipates and everyone proceeds to Fairgrounds for donuts, cheese, and drinks in the Better Living Building,
