The Department of Transportation (Department) would like to notify you of the approval of the Town of Brooklyn's Highway Safety project application entitled "FY 2015 Comprehensive DUI Enforcement Program for Resident Trooper Towns" effective November 28, 2014 through September 12, 2015.

Federal funds in the amount of \$ 15,000.00 are obligated to this project in accordance with the approved 2015 Fiscal Year Connecticut Highway Safety Plan.

All costs incurred under this project must be in full compliance with both federal and State regulations, policies, and procedures that govern the use of highway safety funds. Costs are subject to review by both Department Accounts Examiners and Federal Auditors.

Please note that deviations from the specifics of the approved budget must be reviewed and approved by the Highway Safety Office prior to their implementation in order for related costs to be eligible for reimbursement.

The DUI reimbursement package is now available, in digital form, on the Department's web site: <http://www.ct.gov/dot/site> under Programs and Services, Highway Safety Programs. All final claims against this project, together with all supporting financial documentation, must be submitted to the Highway Safety Office no later than thirty (30) days after the project period ending date.



First Selectman Ives,

This office has reviewed the Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTICIP) application for the subject project, along with the supplemental materials and revised final cost estimate provided by the Municipality, and finds them acceptable. We are now preparing to issue the Commitment to Fund letter for the project.

It should be noted that the total project cost in the latest estimate (attached) is lower than what was submitted with the original application based on scope refinements recommended by the Department. This office was also informed by NECCOG that the Town of Brooklyn will administer acquisition of the easement necessary for construction of a portion of the sidewalk. Because the rights of way administration responsibility and total project cost to be reflected in the Commitment to Fund letter differ from what was originally endorsed by the Town and NECCOG in the original application, we need both the Town's and NECCOG's endorsement of the changes prior to issuing the Commitment to Fund letter.

The (rounded) costs to be reflected in the Commitment to Fund letter are as follows:

Rights of Way:	\$ 30,000
Contract items:	\$ 162,200
Contingencies:	\$ 16,220
Incidentals to Construction:	\$ 16,220
Eligible Utility Relocations:	\$ 30,000
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Total Funding Commitment:	\$ 254,640

If the rights of way administration responsibility being assigned to the Town and the revised costs outlined above are acceptable to the Town and NECCOG, it is requested that the First Selectman and NECCOG's Executive Director each indicate their concurrence to this office via e-mail (please cc each other on your e-mails). Once concurrence from both parties is received, the Commitment to Fund letter will be issued.
