**TOWN OF BROOKLYN, CONNECTICUT
RESOLUTION FOR AWARD OF \$4,155,000
GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES**

WHEREAS, the Town of Brooklyn, Connecticut (the "Town"), through its legislative process, has duly authorized the issuance of its bonds or notes for various capital improvements (collectively, the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, some of the authorizations provide that the Board of Selectmen and Treasurer are authorized to issue temporary notes in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of said bonds or notes; and

WHEREAS, the Town issued its \$4,190,000 General Obligation Bond Anticipation Notes dated August 12, 2014, maturing August 11, 2015, and its \$1,100,000 General Obligation Bond Anticipation Notes dated March 12, 2015 maturing August 11, 2015 (the "Prior Notes"); and

WHEREAS, the First Selectman and Treasurer decided to renew the Prior Notes upon their maturity on August 11, 2015 and issue the Town's \$4,155,000 General Obligation Bond Anticipation Notes dated August 11, 2015, maturing August 10, 2016 (the "New Notes");

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2015 the Board of Selectmen approved the terms and conditions of the New Notes and delegated the authority to solicit and review proposals from prospective purchasers of the New Notes to the First Selectman and Treasurer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the proposal to purchase the New Notes at par, in the stated amount at the stated interest rate, plus the stated premium, which yield the stated net interest cost as follows, as detailed in the attached copy of the proposal, together with accrued interest from the date of the New Notes to the date of delivery, is accepted, and the New Notes are hereby awarded to said purchaser, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the proposal, and the interest rate on the New Notes shall be fixed as specified in said proposal.
