3. 2017/2018 budget

Rick Ives reported on Brooklyn's budget. With a lack of a state budget, Brooklyn only received a portion of ECS grant, about 300,000 less than last year. This is of great concern and if there continues to be no state budget in the next thirty days, there will be cuts too many departments including employees due to lack of state funds.

4. Big E bus trip discussion

There were some complaints about the transportation that was used for Big E. A school bus instead of a coach bus was used for cost savings so there was no bathroom available, and the

ride was bumpy. The driver got lost on the way, and took an alternate route on the way home, making the ride much longer and uncomfortable. The Recreation director apologized and will look into the situation for next year.

5. Concerts at Riverside Park/car cruise

The concerts went very well. There were at least 60 audience members at each concert. It was a successful first year.

The car cruise /bike rodeo saw 15 to 20 kids learning bike safety. All the bike helmets were given away as well as many other gifts. The Brooklyn business association bought two bikes at Walmart so the children who did not bring bikes could participate riding the bike course. Bucky and the commission are very grateful for their generosity.
